


This month's mom+daughter connection is all about:

As promised, we've done most of the planning and thinking for you to have a formative connecting conversation with your girl.

- Watch "3 Christ-Centered Valentine's Day Crafts" featuring lead teacher Staci Rudolph. You and your daughter might want to look at it ahead of time so you can decide which craft supplies you need to collect.
- Make one of the crafts suggested in the video or design one of your own. Just be sure it directs the recipient to the love of God. As you create something beautiful, have a conversation about God's love. You can also use this time to write on the True Girl Valentine's Day cards you plan to share with friends.
- Read I John 4:7 with your daughter while you're crafting. Talk to her about the verse. Here are some discussion questions:





How can you keep your mind aware of the Truth that God is the source of True Love?

You might also use this conversation time to check in on her devos and make sure she's doing OK on her own. If she's struggling, talk about why and encourage

her to press into developing the habit of reading God's Word and journaling every day. We all could use a little motivation now and then to stick with it.
