"That is why I tell you not to worry about everyday life—whether you have enough food and drink, or enough clothes to wear. Isn't life more than food, and your body more than clothing? Look at the birds. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns, for your heavenly Father feeds them. And aren't you far more valuable to him than they are?" {Matthew 6:25–26}

ears ago, I heard a faint flapping sound on my front porch. I discovered a tiny bird had gotten trapped in the tall pillars that held up the roof. There was a small opening at the top. And this bird was flapping waaaaaayyyy down in the bottom.

I petitioned my husband Bob to use a jigsaw to carve a great, big, old, ugly hole in the bottom of that pillar. Then, I reached down and lifted that frightened little guy out. He looked at me nervously for a moment. I opened my hand. He flew off.

If I care enough about a bird to ruin my porch pillar, how much more does God care? He created our feathered friends. And how much more does He care for you and me? So much more. Matthew 6:25–26 reminds us to do something important when we feel anxious about the future: look at the birds.

ACTION POINT: The birds start to get hungry about this time of year. There are fewer bugs and berries to eat. Maybe consider partinening with God in caring for them by putting out a healthy snack of seeds or berries.

like to think I'm a giving person. If someone asks me for gum or a chip, it isn't a problem for me to share. The ravens brought him bread and meat each morning and evening, and he drank from the brook. {1 Kings 17:6}

oday's focus verse is about Elijah, a prophet. During a time of drought and famine, God told Elijah to go to a brook called Cherith. There, God promised to provide for him by commanding ravens (a type of bird) to bring him food.

Now, if I were Elijah, I might have thought, *Wait a second. God. Are You sure about this? Ravens don't do that!* But Elijah obeyed God right away and went to that brook. He trusted God's promise to provide, even though it seemed a little ridiculous. And, sure enough, those birds came every morning and evening carrying bread and meat for Elijah!

This story reminds you that God may ask you to do things that seem a little crazy or outside your comfort zone. He might lead you to take a step of faith that others might not understand. God will always provide for your needs when you trust Him.

ACTION POINT: Look outside and see if you can find a bird to watch. Say a prayer like this. "Thank You, God, that You can do amazing things like make birds bring food to people! I trust You to provide for me!"

uke 11:9–10 used to confuse me. These verses say that if I seek, I will find. So, why doesn't God always give me what I want? Sometimes, I feel let down when I ask Him for something, and He doesn't give it to me. Does that mean these verses are a lie?

They don't say that if we ask for something, God will give it to us. They say we will find and receive His answer when we seek Him out. He will answer us, but that doesn't mean He will answer how we think He should.

In the verses following these, Jesus explains that no good father gives his child a stone when the child asks for bread. In the same way, our heavenly Father only gives us what is best for us. Sometimes, what we think will make us happy isn't good for us. That's why our gracious Father so lovingly provides only His best.

ACTION POINT: What have you asked God for lately? Maybe you feel let down that his answer has been no. Ask him to help you to trust him even when he doesn't give you what you want.

# The Perfect Gift

Every generous act and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights; with Him there is no variation or shadow cast by

turning. { James 1:17 HCSB }

y husband is a pastor and is a little nerdy because he knows Greek words. One of the words he knows is *dorema*, the word for "perfect gift" in James 1:17. My husband liked this word so much that he wanted to name our daughter Dorema because she would be our perfect gift from God.

Little did we know that we would never get to meet little Dorema because she died before birth. At first thought, it felt as though God had given us a gift and had snatched her away. But now, after my mama's heart has had time to heal, I see He still gave me a gift through the short life that Dorema had.

Now, I can be thankful that God gave her to me, if only for a short time. Dorema is a perfect gift that keeps giving to others because God uses me to encourage other mamas who hurt after losing a baby.

This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him. {1 John 5:14–15 NIV}

his verse kinda makes God sound like a vending machine—like we will get whatever we ask for from Him. But we need to note something important to understand what this verse *actually* means! This verse says we will get whatever we ask of God . . . **according to His will**.

God's will is the thing that God knows is best for us. He has perfect plans to provide for us, and sometimes our desires fit into those plans, but sometimes they don't! When we pray, it is important to ask God for help understanding His will and plan.

When Mary was visited by an angel with the news that she would be the mother of Jesus, she had plans of her own. Giving birth to the Savior was *not* in Mary's plans AT ALL! But she prayed in a way that said "yes" to God's plan. She wanted her life to be lived according to the will of God, not her own plans. Do you?

ACTION POINT: Write a prayer that tells God "yes" to something that's going on in your life. Tell Him that you want to know and live according to His plan.

So, if you cling to His Word and promises, He will be faithful to lead you through the valley of the shadow of death and over every mountain until you reach the sunny fields of green.

ACTION POINT: How can you find comfort in God's presence when you're fearful? Is it by reading your Bible? Spending time in prayer? Or asking your mom for help? Try at least one of these steps the next time you fear something.

# Fix the Wi-Fi!

Therefore repent and return, so that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord. { Acts 3:19 NASB }

he game isn't loading!" I shouted to my friend. "It says I'm connected to your Wi-Fi, but it won't load!" I was ready to play my favorite game with her, and the Wi-Fi was determined to stand in our way. "Let me restart the modem!" After she restarted it, we were ready to let the gaming begin!

Sometimes, we need this in our relationship with God. When we become stuck in a pattern of sin, it causes an interference in our connection with Him, just like that Wi-Fi situation. Technically, our connection with Him through Jesus is still there, but the signal isn't the greatest. We can't download or upload information from or to Him very well. When we repent or turn from our sins, we experience a strong, refreshed connection. Choosing to say no to sin and walk in a way that pleases Him restarts the modem of our hearts so we experience Him more clearly.

ACTION POINT: Is there a sin you haven't turned from? Something that you know doesn't make God happy? Tell God you agree that the sin you're involved in doesn't please Him. Ask Him to help you repent and turn away from it.
