All the Time, No Matter What!

But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners. { Romans 5:8 }

Ninety-two percent of girls are sure God loves them. It's great that so many girls believe this, but the Truth is even better. God loves 100% of humans *all the time*, no matter what. And that includes you! Even so, it is hard for some girls to believe when they have done something bad, like disobeying their parents or cheating on a test. Sometimes, their feelings lie to them.

Lie: "God only loves me when I'm good."

Have you ever believed that lie? Most of us have at some point. Sin makes it difficult to *feel* God's love. Trying to feel connected to God after we sin can be like trying to download a song when you don't have good Wi-Fi. **But God is still there. And He still loves you!** Yes, He feels sad when you sin, and sometimes there are consequences, but that doesn't mean He doesn't love you.

ACTION POINT: If you feel like God doesn't love you when you sin, try telling someone about what you're feeling and why. Maybe your mom can help you to better understand God's constant love.

I Love You Tag

See how very much our Father loves us, for he calls us his children, and that is what we are! { 1 John 3:1 }

e once read a story to our girls about an old couple who played a special game of tag. The goal was to write the acronym "SHMILY" ("See How Much I Love You") in a surprise place for each other to find. One time, this grandmother even unrolled toilet paper to write SHMILY on the last sheet for her husband. There was no end to the places SHMILY would pop up.

God sent His Son, Jesus, to stretch out His arms wide on a cross to say SHMILY to you! "See how very much our Father loves" you, dear daughter?! (1 John 3:1). There's no end to the places God's SHMILY pops up. When you see His moon winking at you, or a loving parent tucks you in bed, or you read one of God's love notes from His Word, Jesus is saying SHMILY to you.

It's now your turn to tell God how much you love Him! Tag—you're IT!

ACTION POINT: Play "I Love You Tag" with your family. Look for times to say or write SHMILY to each other. Even more importantly, find creative and meaningful ways you can say SHMILY to your Savior every day.

ave you ever had a conversation with a snake? The first woman, Eve, did. It was a BAD idea! She istened to Satan's lies (he was disguised as the serpent), and she disobeyed God. Yep, Eve messed up BIG TIME! But she wasn't the only one who did. So did her husband, Adam. And there were consequences for their sin. God punished everyone involved: Eve, Adam, and the snake. Today's verse includes part of the serpent's punishment.

But this story isn't *all* bad news. Within these consequences, there was also a promise for Eve. It was a promise that God made AFTER she ate the fruit. AFTER she hid from Him. AFTER she blamed her actions on the snake. And that promise was that someday, Jesus would be one of her descendants, and He would provide freedom from sin.

God's love for Eve didn't change after she messed up. And, True Girl, His love for you doesn't either.

ACTION POINT: What is the enemy disguised as in your life? Whose lies might you be listening to? Ask God to give you the wisdom and strength to obey Him.

But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. { Ephesians 2:4–5 NIV }

othing lives in my garden in the wintertime. It's too cold. All the vegetables are completely dead and covered in snow. What can dead things do? Absolutely nothing. They're dead.

Ephesians 2 begins with a dramatic statement: You were dead because of your disobedience and your many sins. Sounds awful. What can you do? Nothing ... you're dead. Then suddenly, the love of God breaks forth like a warm beam of sunlight to melt the cold snow of your heart and shine His rich mercy in you. HE MAKES YOU ALIVE ... even when you are dead.

Like a recently watered seed, take a moment and soak up this truth. God loves you. He made you alive because of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. This is most certainly true. It is by grace you have been saved.

ACTION POINT: Plant a seed in an indoor pot this winter. Remember, it's dead. It cannot bring itself to life. It needs soil, water, and sunlight to make it come alive!

This is how we have come to know love: He laid down his life for us. We should also lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. $\{1 \text{ John 3:16 CSB }\}$

s a family, we make it a priority not to use certain words in our home. There is one specific word that's allowed sometimes, and other times it's not. The word is "hate."

If someone says, "I hate moldy bread," that is allowed. If they say, "I hate these shoes—they are too small," that is allowed. If someone says, "I hate my sister," that is NOT allowed. To hate something is to say you want something to be thrown away, placed in the garbage and to declare that it is without value to you. When talking about people created in God's image, we are called by God to love, not hate.

First John 3:16 is one of my favorite verses because it shows us what love is. Love is doing what Jesus did. Jesus died on the cross so He could declare us to have value and we could know love. His love. He loves you so much, True Girl, just as you are.

ACTION POINT: How can you practice true love today? Maybe play with a younger sibling even though you don't like to play with them, or do a chore for your mom. Take the love of Jesus and pass it on!

My child, don't reject the LORD's discipline, and don't be upset when he corrects you. For the LORD corrects those he loves, just as a father corrects a child in whom he delights. { Proverbs 3:11–12 }

here are times in our lives when we have to be really loud, right? Flying around on a roller coaster, telling someone to "Watch out!" or singing at the top of our lungs at a True Girl event—those are all times to GET LOUD!

once did something I knew I wasn't supposed to: plau with a ball in my parents' bedroom. I threw it and hit candle holders on my mom's dresser. They broke. I cried and apoloaized. Have you ever done something like that and wondered if your friend, parent, or God would forgive and

Today's verse is part of the story of Paul. Paul's name was originally Saul, and he persecuted (or punished) Christians in the early church. He did everything he could to stop Christianity. But God loved Saul and knew he had a purpose. So, Jesus met Saul on the road to Damascus. (See Paul's whole storu in Acts 9:1-19.)

God changed Saul's name to Paul, and Paul spent the rest of his life telling others about Jesus. Isn't that amazing!? God loved Paul SO much that He turned Paul's life around. If God can do that for Paul, imagine how much forgiveness and love He has for you, even when you sin!

ACTION POINT: The next time you do something wrong, be like Paul: ask God for forgiveness and then go tell others about His forgiveness and love.

"For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes inhim will not perish but have eternal life." { John 3:16 }

any of us are familiar with today's verse. We see it on the cover of journals, on bracelets, and even on billboards, but do we stop to understand what it means?

God so loved you that He paid the ultimate price: having His Son Jesus die on the cross to pay for your sins. That includes your past sins, any sins you may commit today, and even your future sins. He will never stop loving you or regret dying for you.

ACTION POINT: Read today's verse out loud and replace the word "everyone" with your name. Then, write it on a small card and hang it where you see it daily to remind yourself that God loves you.

ne day, my friend Selene and I got a little *too* adventurous and wandered farther along a creek than we ever had before. We were being careful not to get too wet as we hopped from rock to rock, but I slipped. My white canvas shoe sunk deep down into the muddy creek bank. Selene grabbed my hand and helped pull me out. We went back to her house with my ruined shoe, and Selene tried to help me wash it, but the mud was caked on thick.

Sometimes, life can get a little muddy, just like my shoe. Life gets especially muddy when we sin. We sin when we think, say, or do anything that misses God's mark—just like I missed the mark when I stuck my foot in the mud instead of on the next rock! But God can do something that Selene couldn't. He can lift us out and clean us up! He is the best helper around.

ACTION POINT: Draw a picture of God lifting you out of a muddy place. The next time you find yourself in a muddy place, pull out that picture and ask God to clean you up and put you back on the rock.

im the type of girl who feels guilty over pretty much everything. So, it's easy for me to feel like a failure before God when I sin. It can be easy to feel like we are just too broken and unlovable—even for God. Thankfully, that's a lie!

God loved us even before we loved Him. We were dead in our sins—drawn to it like a pig goes to mud— but He loved us too much to leave us in the muck of our sins. So, He showed what real love looks like when He died for the sins of us all. We don't deserve His love, but He gives it anyway!

Don't believe the lies your mind may tell you, saying that you are just too far gone for God to love you. He loves you even when you sin and reaches out His hand to help you. That's true love!

ACTION POINT: Journal your thoughts on today's verse. Pour your heart out and be honest with the Lord about your feelings. Ask Him to help you understand this verse and what it means to be loved even when you feel unlovable.

Then David confessed to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." Nathan replied, "Yes, but the LORD has forgiven you, and you won't die for this sin." { 2 Samuel 12:13 }

ne of my favorite episodes of VeggieTales is *King George and the Ducky*. If you've never seen it, it's tht tale of King George's love for rubber duckies. He loves them SO much that he steals young Thomas' *only* ducky. The episode is based on 2 Samuel 11–12 and is the story of King David stealing another man's wife and murdering her husband. Yikes!

While Veggie Tales changed some details, one thing is the same in both versions of the story: one of God's prophets has a hard conversation with the king. The prophet helps the king see his sin and turn away from it. Today's verse is King David's response after the prophet Nathan talked to him.

People telling us the truth about our sins shows God's love for us. While nothing can change how God feels about us, God doesn't want us to stay in our sin—and sometimes He uses other people to help us turn away from it.

ACTION POINT: Has your mom or a friend ever talked to you about a sin in your life? What was your response? How could you respond better next time?

But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things! { Galatians 5:22–23 }

o you know what happens when an apple tree doesn't have enough water? The apples fall off before they are ripe! Spraying the outside of the tree with water won't help. The tree has to soak up water from its roots and keep soaking it up so there is a constant supply for every branch. Can you see any trees outside? Try counting their branches! Imagine water traveling from the roots to each branch. That's a lot of water!

Just like trees need water coursing through their roots to produce fruit, we need the Holy Spirit living in us to produce spiritual fruit. Spiritual fruit doesn't fill up our tummies the way an apple might. But it fills up our hearts AND the hearts of others. When we spend time with Jesus, He makes us more like Him! Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. Point out anything in me that offends you, and lead me along the path of everlasting life. { Psalms 139:23–24 }

o you know anyone who really knows you inside and out? God does! In today's verses, the author asks God to search the deepest part of him and show him what is not God-honoring in his life. Wow! It takes a lot of humility to ask this because God will show us what to fix. The real question is: Are we willing to correct what needs fixing? It takes a lot of work and effort to get rid of sin in our lives.

The thing is, our sin creates a barrier between us and God. It's just like when you get into trouble. Your relationship with that person you hurt is broken until you make it right. ACTION POINT: Ask the Lord to search your heart and show you any area He wants you to work on. God is not asking for perfection, just a willing heart.

like fruit. Fruit is good! These verses tell me that Jesus (the Son) and God (the Father) work together to produce spiritual fruit in us. You see, Jesus gives us the food we need to grow fruit. He is our vine. God is our gardener. He is there so that we grow and bear fruit.

Sometimes, growing means pruning. If you don't know what pruning is, it means taking a knife or scissors (called shears) and cutting away pieces of the branch so that they will grow even more than before. Pruning can be hard! When God is pruning me, sometimes, I want to tell Him that I want to keep those things that He has decided aren't good for me. Yet the results of pruning ARE good, even when it doesn't feel like it!

God wants us to grow big and healthy so we can produce more good fruit. God wants us to flourish, even when it means pruning.

ACTION POINT: Take some time today to read John 15 and learn more about how Jesus wants you to grow. Ask yourself if He is showing you something that He doesn't want to be in your life.

The grass withers and the flowers fade, but the word of our God stands forever. { Isaiah 40:8 }

Inverse fade. And not just after they bloom. Scientists warn that 45% of the world's known flowering plants could be threatened by extinction. That's almost half of them! Those under threat include orchids, varieties of pineapple, and many important crop species. Of the nearly 19,000 new plants and fungi species discovered since 2020, 77% are thought to be endangered.

Can you imagine a world without flowers? I don't want to, but they are fading.

The Bible says that in contrast to the fading flowers in our world, the words of God will stand strong forever. This verse is referring to the Old Testament prophecies, many of which are written in the book of Isaiah and other prophetic books like Jeremiah and Micah and Habakkuk.

When I was about eight years old, Isaiah 40:8 became one of my favorite verses. I believe it. God's word will last forever. Do you believe that?

ACTION POINT: Use a journal or blank notebook to answer my question. Do you believe that God's words will last forever?

hen I was about your age, I wrote a bad note to a friend, and her dad found that note. He called my dad and my dad read the note! He was so disappointed in me. I was so sad because I hated feeling far away from my dad. But you know what? My dad forgave me, and I didn't feel far from him for long. It took a little time, but eventually, I was crawling back up in his lap again, and we were laughing together.

When you sin against God, it might feel like He will never forgive you. Or you might feel like He forgives you, but He's never going to show love to you again. But that's not how He is at all! When we've done wrong, and we repent (meaning we tell God we're sorry and choose not to do it again), God doesn't keep making us feel bad for it. He forgives us and loves us!

ACTION POINT: Is there something you know God has forgiven you for doing, but you still feel like He's mad at you for it? Talk to Him about that. Ask Him to help you see that you are forgiven and loved.
