Moses answered the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today. The Egyptians you see today you will never see again. The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still." { Exodus 14:13-14 NIV }



t was the last day of fifth grade, and I felt afraid. My family was moving out of state, so I had to say goodbye to my friends. Overwhelmed, I asked my

teacher, "What am I going to do, Mrs. Miller? What if I go to this new school and no one wants to be my friend?"

It was then that Mrs. Miller brought up Exodus 14:13–14. "I understand you're afraid, dear," she said, "but remember what the Lord has promised us: 'The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still."

Sometimes, in moments of fear, we can try to control a situation to make ourselves feel better. But most of the time, trying to do everything ourselves and not surrendering to God only makes the situation worse! When it came to moving, it was when I understood that the Lord was FOR me, not against me, that I could trust Him with my life.

ACTION POINT: What are some ways you can practice "being still" and trusting the Lord in your life today? Write them down and thank Him for protecting you.

Bad Apples

I have been sent to ... teach them to know the truth that shows them how to live godly lives. This truth gives them confidence that they have eternal life, which God—who does not lie—promised them before the world began. { Titus 1:1-2 }

ave you ever bitten into an apple only to find it brown and mushy on the inside? Yuck! It looks deliciously crisp and juicy on the outside, but on the inside, it's rotten to the core. In the book of Titus, Paul and Titus face the same problem—except instead of rotten apples. Titus is

dealing with rotten people!

Some people in Titus' church claimed to know God, but they didn't act like it. Just like a rotten apple that looks good on the outside, these people were saying one thing and doing the opposite. In our verses, Paul encourages Titus by reminding him that knowing the truth shows us how to live godly lives. What we know about God should show itself in the way we live. Knowing the truth helps us live with confidence.

ACTION POINT: Does how you live match the truth of God's Word? Ask God to reveal places where you're not living out the truth. Ask Him for forgiveness, and think of one step you can take to confidently show the truth you know.



Slow Down, Moses!

So God sent back the same man his people had previously rejected when they demanded, "Who made you a ruler and judge over us?" Through the angel who appeared to him in the burning bush, God sent Moses to be their ruler and savior. { Acts 7:35 }

> id you know that Moses got ahead of God's plan? Scripture says that when he was forty, he saw an Egyptian mistreating an Israelite. Moses killed the

Egyptian! Acts 7:25 says, "Moses assumed his fellow Israelites would realize that God had sent him to rescue them, but they didn't." Moses fled to the wilderness after his rescue attempt didn't go well!

Here's the thing. Moses was right! Not in killing the Egyptian but in believing that part of God's purpose for him was to deliver the Israelites from Egyptian slavery. Forty years later, when Moses was eighty, today's verse records that God sent Moses back to the Israelites in Egypt to "be their ruler and savior."

God has a purpose and a plan for you, too! And His timing in your life is perfect. So, if you're eager to get ahead, but God says, "Slow down!" learn from Moses.

ACTION POINT: What else can you learn about standing for truth from the life of Moses? Spend some time flipping through the book of Exodus and reading other stories about Moses.

What's Holding You Up?

Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. { Proverbs 3:5-6 ESV }



an you think of all the reasons we lean on things? Here are some I thought of:

1. We lean on a friend if we're trying to keep from falling off a balance beam.

2. We lean on a cane or crutches if we need help walking.

ave you ever buttoned your shirt only to realize you skipped a buttonhole? Now your shirt is lopsided, and you have to start all over again!

he world is made up of thinkers and feelers. Thinkers tend to be driven by their thoughts and reasoning, while feelers are often led by their emotions. I tend to be more emotionally driven. I can remember insights I learned and still go with what I feel. I've been working on this with the Lord. One thing that's changed my heart for the better is learning that Truth is a person. And that person is Jesus. He said it Himself in John 14:6: "I am the way, the TRUTH, and the life."

Hearing and reading God's Word is great, but transformation and freedom don't come until we know Jesus and submit to His power. I'm learning to rely on every word He's spoken instead of my ever-changing thoughts and emotions. I'm no longer thoughts or emotions-driven. I'm Jesus driven!

ACTION POINT: Are you driven more by your thoughts or emotions? No matter which you're led by more, ask God to help you submit both to His Truth. Ask Him to help you be Jesus driven!

n our world, it seems like the easiest way to receive praise from people is to be charming, skilled, or beautiful. That can fool us into thinking we should focus on becoming

those things. However, Proverbs 31:30 tells us that this is a trick. Charm is deceptive. Beauty goes away! So, what are we supposed to focus on?

Thankfully, the verse tells us that we are supposed to focus on respecting the Lord. When we do this, it fixes our priorities. It gets rid of the trickiness of charm and exposes the lies of beauty. Focusing on the Lord teaches us how to live our lives the way He has called us to—with purity, dignity, and love. I'd say that's a lot better than anything the world seems to offer.

ACTION POINT: Do a self-check! What are you focused on right now? What can you do to either improve your focus or change it if needed? Talk about it with your mom or a trusted adult.

Heart of Worship

And the parts we regard as less honorable are those we clothe with the greatest care. So we carefully protect those parts that should not be seen. {1 Corinthians 12:23 }

ACTION POINT: First Corinthians 12:23 teaches us that every part of the body is valuable, even the less noticeable parts. Let's worship with our hearts by dressing modestly and acting with integrity, honoring ourselves and others because of who we are in Christ.

The LORD detests lying lips, but he delights in those who tell the truth. { Proverbs 12:22 }



t seems that nothing is faster than a lie. Before you know it, one runs out your mouth like it's in the hundred-yard dash and crosses the finish line of

someone's ears before you even realize the race began! We lie to make our stories more interesting so people won't think we're boring, to avoid disappointing others, or even to protect someone from something we believe would hurt them.



n 2001, I started having endless thoughts about Africa, especially while praying. I could not stop being obsessed with the needs of the people there. I finally

went to my mom and my husband. I asked them to pray for God to open a door for me. I begged God to show me His plan before December of that year, but He did not. Did I stop praying? No.

Another year went by. In December 2002, I received an email I will never forget. It was a request for me to write a purity curriculum and share the salvation message in the government schools of Zambia, a country in Africa. The man had been praying for someone like me to come, and I had been praying for a way to go to Africa. Together, we reached 75,000 students. I'm so glad that I kept praying!

Sometimes, God doesn't answer us right away because He wants us to better understand what we need or are asking for. Sometimes, He waits so we can be grateful for the gift when it comes along. Other times, God knows we are not ready and need to mature.

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom if God has ever asked her to wait a long time for something she prayed for. Talk about it. Then pray together that God would give you patience and persistence in your prayer life.

Seeing Beyond the Surface

But the LORD said to Samuel, "Don't judge by his appearance or height, for I have rejected him. The LORD doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." {1 Samuel16.7 }

> n 1 Samuel 16:7, when Samuel was choosing the next king of Israel, God told him not to judge by outward appearances because God looks at the heart. This

instruction was important because Samuel was focusing too much on how people looked on the outside, like their height or appearance, rather than their inner qualities. God wanted Samuel to understand that true worth and goodness come from what's inside a person, not just what can be seen on the surface.

Imagine if we judged people only by how they look. We'd miss out on getting to know amazing people that God places in our lives, just because they don't match our idea of beauty or strength.

ACTION POINT: Today, let's strive to see others through God's eyes instead of by how they look or what they wear. Ask God to help you see people the way He sees them, with love and compassion. Then, choose to treat others with kindness and acceptance, just as God accepts us for who we are on the inside.

The First-Ever Fashion Designer

And the LORD God made clothing from animal skins for Adam and his wife. { Genesis 3:21 }

> id you know that God was the first-ever fashion designer? It's true! In Genesis 3:21, God made the very first clothes for Adam and Eve. But these

clothes weren't created for a runway. They were designed for something very important.

Before Adam and Eve sinned, they didn't need clothes. They could be naked without being embarrassed or ashamed because they were perfect. They didn't need to hide themselves from God or each other. But when they disobeyed God, they realized they were naked and hid themselves from Him. Sin entered the world, and they could no longer be in God's presence like they were before.

Because of their sin, God had to send Adam and Eve out of the Garden of Eden. But before He did, He created the very first clothes from animal skins. Their clothes served as a reminder that they needed God to cover their sin and that one day, their sin would be covered not by clothes, but by the blood of Jesus!

ACTION POINT: What we wear sends a message. How can you dress to honor God and show your need for Him? The next time you decide what to wear, ask yourself: How can I honor God with what I wear today?

was unprepared for the test. I grabbed paper, jotted down a few helpful hints and answers, and slid it up the sleeve of my sweater. When the test began, I got

one answer, then two, but on the third, I noticed my teacher looking disappointedly in my direction. He came over to my desk and escorted me to the principal's office.

After receiving my punishment (failing the test AND getting detention), I heard lots of whispers about me and what I'd done. It was humiliating and hurt my reputation with the teachers and students. I'd once been seen as an honest person, but after that incident, I became the girl who cheated. Dishonest, cheater, and liar were labels I wore for a while.

The worst thing wasn't that people were gossiping about me but that what they said was true. Accusations and negativity will present themselves in your life, but don't let them be true. Keep your conscience clear and your character clean.

ACTION POINT: Reflect on your actions and decisions, both when others are watching and when they're not. If it seems like you're living a double life, ask Jesus to help you live a life of honesty and integrity that shows you belong to Him.
